## **READING:** Genesis 17:1-7, 15-16

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the Lord appeared to Abram, and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous." Then Abram fell on his face; and God said to him, "As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham; for I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations. I will make you exceedingly fruitful; and I will make nations of you, and kings shall come from you. I will establish my covenant between me and you, and your offspring after you throughout their generations, for an everlasting covenant, to be God to you and to your offspring after you.

## PSALM: 22:22-30 (read antiphonally by whole verse)

- 24 My praise is of God in the great assembly; I will perform my vows in the presence of those who worship God.

### GOSPEL: Mark 8:31-38

Reader: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark.

Jesus began to teach his disciples that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things."

He called the crowd with his disciples, and said to them, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. #### **HOLY COMMUNION**

Celebrant God is with you.

People And also with you.

Celebrant Lift up your hearts.

People We lift them to God.

Celebrant Let us give thanks to God.

People It is right to give our thanks and praise.

<u>Celebrant</u>: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks to you, Loving God. By water and the Holy Spirit, you have made us a new people in Jesus Christ, to show forth your glory in all the world. Therefore, we praise you, joining our voices with every nameless and unremembered child of God, and with all the company of heaven, singing:

Celebrant and People sing "Santo, Santo, Santo"

On the night he was given over to suffering and death, Jesus took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

The Celebrant continues:

Recalling now Christ's suffering, death, and resurrection, we gather at this table with bread and wine in celebration of life and love, work, play and rest, the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and Her presence in our lives. Send your Spirit upon these gifts. Let them be for us the Body and Blood of Christ. And grant that we who eat this bread and drink this cup may be filled with your life and goodness. All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty God, now and forever. AMEN.

### **POSTLUDE**

## **BLACK HISTORY MONTH**



A significant number of enslaved
Africans brought to the Americas
during the trans-Atlantic slave trade
were Muslims, with large
concentrations located in South
Carolina, the Georgia Sea Islands, and

Louisiana. A prominent example of an early African Muslim enslaved in the Americas, Ayyub ibn Sulayman (1701-1773), was born to a prominent family in Bondu, which is present-day Senegal. He was captured and sold to an enslaver in Maryland. His life was chronicled in a biography called Some Memoirs of the Life of Job, the Son of Solomon (Thomas Bluett). Another example is Bilali Mohamet, who led an informal militia of 80 enslaved men prepared to defend Georgia's Sapelo Island from British invasion during the War of 1812. The presence of enslaved African Muslims like Ayyub and Bilali can be found throughout 19th c. American literature. Herman Melville wrote of them in his story, "Benito Cereno," and Harriet Beecher Stowe wrote about an African American Muslim in Dred, A Tale of the Great Dismal Swamp.
